

A guide when entering the YPU competition

All digital images submitted, either for the Projected or print, must have have a pixel size no greater than 1600 wide by 1200 high for landscape and 1200 high for portrait mode.





- The file size must be no larger than 2Mb (the software calculates in millions of bytes as opposed to megabytes (which is 2,097,152 bytes) The difference is subtle, so i would suggest if your file is 2Mb, then it will need reducing.
- · The colour space should be sRGB
- The file format should be Baseline (standard) NOT progressive
- · All files should be .jpg
- The mounts must be a standard size of 400mm x 500mm +/- 2mm and not exceeding 4mm thickness
- Your name and title should be written on the rear of the mount on the top left hand corner (this helps to identify which is the top of the image- sounds silly but it's not always obvious)
- Entrants must own the copyright of the image
- · The use of copyright free images is not allowed
- The work must be entirely that of the photographer
- Any image accepted at previous YPU Annual Exhibitions is ineligible for entry. However, if
 your image was entered and didn't get accepted then you can re-enter it. Although, I would
 say that your photography has improved from last year and you have better images to enter
- Same image cannot be submitted into both Print and Projected

When completing the entry form, try and list your image categories together i.e.

Day at the sea Open Colour Night at Sea Open Colour Sheep Nature Dog Nature

By doing this it makes it easier for the person entering your images onto the system and helps to avoid any mistakes.

If you are completing your form by hand, please ensure your writing is clear and readable Each year, prior to the competition, the club will inform members who to send your images to and the method by which they should be sent. Members will also be informed of the cost to enter and to whom and how they should pay.
