**"Classic Cotswolds Tour"** : Bourton-on-the-Water, The Slaughters and Naunton

[access level: easy - some walking around the villages on level ground; the amount of walking is flexible!]

Join us for a day that has it all - the busy village of Bourton-on-the-Water with the river Windrush, the Bourton ducks (& tourists!) and classic Cotswold buildings. Follow this by exploring the less well visited but hugely picturesque villages of the Slaughters with the river Eye running through, ancient churches and classic Cotswold landscapes; then on to Naunton where we'll meet the river Windrush again in a truly magnificent setting.

### **Itinerary:**

- \* 08.30 Pick up
- \* 09.30 Arrive in Bourton-on-the-Water. We spend 2.5 hours in the classic Cotswold village of Bourton, with a coffee break, exploring the village and immediate surroundings on foot
- \* 12.00 We head by car to the neighbouring villages of Lower and Upper Slaughter. We have lunch here (bring sandwiches) followed by a wander around these two quintessential Cotswold villages.
- \* 14.00 We head west by car to the small village of Naunton nestled in a beautiful valley and with the river Windrush idling through it. Superb! We'll spend the remainder of the afternoon here including a stop at the local pub!
- \* 16.00 We head back by car dropping you off at your pick-up point by around 17.00

**"The Far North East Tour"** : Broadway, Stanton, Stanway and Snowhill

[access level: moderate - expect to walk up to 5km across fairly level ground]

Join us on this slightly more adventurous photographic day that will enable you to capture images of the Cotswolds that fewer others will have done. There is more country walking than on the "Classic" tour but we keep it to largely level ground with the option to do more if you so wish! The "Far North East" tour takes in four stunning villages and their surrounding Cotswold scenery. This will be a day to remember - and to capture with your camera!

### **Itinerary (timings other than pick up and drop off are approximate):**

- \* 08.00 Pick up
- \* 09.00 Arrive at Stanway village for our first exploration and photographic opportunity as we take in the thatched cottages and ancient church of this little hamlet.
- \* 10.00 We head north by car to the small village of Stanton approximately 2km to the north. We will spend about 45 minutes exploring this stereotypically Cotswold village.
- \* 11.00 We head north again but this time **on foot** towards Broadway, approximately 4.5km from Stanton. Along the way we pass by the village of Laverton and through the village of Buckland. Great scenery and a real flavour of being in the Cotswolds.
- \* 13.00 We should arrive in Broadway around 13.00 where we offer you the chance to relax, have some lunch (there are several pubs in Broadway) and explore the village for a few hours.  
Your guide will return to Stanton to collect the transport!
- \* 14.30 We head south by car to Broadway Tower and take in some magnificent views across the Vale of Evesham - a great photographic spot. A small cafe here will provide us with a coffee break.
- \* 15.30 We take the short hop to our final destination of Snowhill. This small, relatively isolated village has a beautiful church and is home to Snowhill Manor – which would be a good half day's visit on its own.
- \* 16.30 We head back by car dropping you off at your pick-up point by around 17.30

**"The Hidden Cotswolds Tour"** : Guiting Power, Kinton, Temple Guiting, Ford and Cutsdean

[access level: moderate - expect to walk up to 6km with some moderate ascents]

Join us for this true Cotswold adventure! With much of the day spent on foot you will get to see, and photograph, the "hidden" Cotswolds - areas that are far less visited by tourists (or, indeed, more local residents). Experience the magnificent Cotswold landscape in its true guise along with little known, but totally stunning, Cotswold villages. A real treat!

### **Itinerary (timings other than pick up and drop off are approximate):**

- \* 08.30 Pick up
- \* 09.30 Arrive at our first stop - the very picturesque village of Guiting Power. Quintessentially Cotswolds and boasting a lovely church, we will spend some time exploring the area.
- \* 10.30 We head north from Guiting Power **on foot** towards the little hamlet of Kinton approximately 2km away. On the way we pass through some stunning woodland / stream scenery as well as more open farming land of the "real" Cotswolds.
- \* 11.30 From Kinton we head north again **by car** towards the village of Temple Guiting another 2km away. The river Windrush passes through here and there are plenty of opportunities for some stunning photographs.
- \* 12.30 We take the **short walk** (about 1.5km) from Temple Guiting to the tiny hamlet of Ford. Small it maybe, but it has a very nice pub where we can stop for lunch.
- \* 14.00 We head off **on foot** to the north about 1km and the very small, but very beautiful, village of Cutsdean. Superb opportunities for some classic Cotswold images are to be had here.
- \* 15.00 The last leg of our tour is a short (1.5km) walk to Stumps Cross. Here, high up on the escarpment, you can look out to the west and north over the Vale of Evesham for some very spectacular views indeed. A great end to the day!
- \* 17.00 Pick up from Stumps Cross and head back home. We should be dropping you off at your original pick up point by 18.00 at the latest.

NEW TOUR FOR 2019!

**“Historic Cotswolds Tour”** : Whithington and Chedworth Roman Villa

[access level: moderate - expect to walk up to 15km with some moderate ascents]

Join AMP Photography for this fabulous tour in the heart of the Cotswolds taking in two great villages (Whithington and Chedworth) plus the historic Chedworth Roman Villa. This is a tour that has to be experienced on foot, so it's leg power all the way! The tour covers superb Cotswold landscapes including expansive wooded areas and more open country, both prime areas for wildlife. The Roman Villa at Chedworth dates back to the 4<sup>th</sup> century AD and is currently owned by the National Trust. The Villa is open from early March to the end of November. Time (and season) permitting we can explore the Villa in more detail (entry to non NT members is about £11).

### **Itinerary (timings other than pick up and drop off are approximate):**

- \* 08.30 Pick up
- \* 09.30 Arrive at Whithington for the start of the tour. We spend some time exploring the village and it's striking church
- \* 10.00 Head off by foot towards Chedworth via Whithington woods before emerging in to more open country. Some terrific landscape photography images can be had out here.
- \* 12.30ish We should arrive at Chedworth village around lunchtime. There is a pub for refreshments and the village itself is worth exploring with your camera.
- \* 14.00 We head north from Chedworth back up in to the high country and the 1.5km walk to the Roman Villa. Nestled within the Chedworth Woods the setting of the Villa makes for some lovely images. Time permitting you will have the option to go into the Villa for a closer look at the historic remains
- \* 15.30ish From the Villa we begin the 4km wander back to Whithington, meeting up with the river Coln on the way. This part of the tour has varied scenery and landscapes as well as opportunity to see and photograph deer that inhabit the wooded areas around here.
- \* 17.00ish Arrive back at Whithington to collect our transport and make our way home to take a look at those amazing images you've captured!

### NEW TOUR FOR 2019!

**“Wild Cotswolds Tour”** : The Rissingtons, Windrush and Sherborne

[access level: moderate - 15km walking tour with some moderate ascents]

If you like landscape and wildlife photography then this is the tour for you! We go for an early start for the best light, heading out to the East Cotswolds - an area dominated by big skies, open landscapes and dotted with the fabulously photogenic small villages of Little and Great Rissington, Windrush and Sherborne (the location for the 2017 “Spring Watch” and “Autumn Watch” television programmes).

### **Itinerary (timings other than pick up and drop off are approximate):**

- \* 07.00 Pick up
- \* 08.00 Arrive at our starting point – the small village of Little Rissington. We have a short time to photograph around the village before heading south on foot to the village of Great Rissington
- \* 09.30 We spend some time exploring Great Rissington and getting some superb images of the village and village life. We can also get refreshments here.
- \* 10.30 From Great Rissington we continue south on foot across the open country to the tiny but stunning village of Windrush.
- \* 12.00 We should arrive in the village of Windrush for lunchtime and a chance to capture some unique images of this superb region of the Cotswolds
- \* 13.00 From Windrush we head west to the village of Sherborne and the Sherborne Estate with opportunity to see and photograph the area featured in the “Spring Watch” TV series.  
From Sherborne we cross the river Windrush and head back towards Great Rissington where we then take a different route back to our starting point at Little Rissington
- \* 16.00 Head back by car to your drop off and a well-earned rest!
