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"Classic Cotswolds Tour" : Moreton-in-Marsh, Stow on the Wold, Bourton-on-the-Water, The Slaughters

Tour Type: Drive-Explore

Join us for a Cotswold Village day that has it all - the busy villages of Moreton-in-Marsh, Stow on the Wold and Bourton-on-the-Water with the river Windrush, the Bourton ducks (& tourists!) and classic Cotswold buildings. Follow this by exploring the smaller, but highly picturesque villages of the Slaughters with the river Eye running through, ancient churches and classic Cotswold landscapes. We finish the tour with a visit to a "mystery" village!

Itinerary:

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| 07.30 | Pick up |
| 08.00 | We start early to beat the crowds in the bustling village of Bourton-on-the-Water. Perhaps the most well-known (and consequently well visited) Cotswold village, Bourton is busy all year round but is well worth a visit for its charming buildings and the river Windrush that flows through the centre of the village. |
| 09.15 | We drive about 8km north to the ancient village of Stow on the Wold for a look around this busy but very historic Cotswold village - the highest in the Cotswolds! Lots to photograph including the sizeable church. |
| 10.30 | We head north again to arrive in Moreton-in-Marsh for a look around this classic Cotswold market village. If you book your tour for a Tuesday then the market will be on and offer some additional photographic opportunities (and the temptation to try some local delicacies!). |
| 11.30 | We head back towards Bourton to the village of Lower Slaughter. Wander around this quintessential Cotswold village and absorb the photographic opportunities it presents. There is the option to take the 1km each-way walk from Lower Slaughter to Upper Slaughter with some further fantastic photographs to be composed on the way. |
| 13.00 | Head off by car for our final stop at a "mystery" village and a flavour of the slightly "quieter Cotswolds"! |
| 14.00 | We head back by car dropping you off at your pick-up point |

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"The Far North West Tour" : , Stanton, Stanway, Snowhill and Broadway Tower

Tour Type: Drive-Walk

Join us on this slightly more adventurous photographic day that will enable you to capture images of the Cotswolds that fewer others will have done. There is more country walking than on the "Classic" tour but we keep it to largely level ground with the option to do more if you so wish! The "Far North West" tour takes in four stunning villages and their surrounding Cotswold scenery. This will be a day to remember - and to capture with your camera!

Itinerary (timings other than pick up and drop off are approximate):

- 08.30 Pick up
- 09.00 Arrive at Stanway village for our first exploration and photographic opportunity as we take in the thatched cottages and ancient church of this little hamlet.
- 10.00 We head north by car to the small village of Stanton approximately 2km to the north. We will spend about 45 minutes exploring this beautiful Cotswold village.
- 11.00 We head back up on to the Cotswold escarpment and drive to the village of Snowhill. This small, relatively isolated village has a beautiful church and is home to Snowhill Manor – which would be a good half day's visit on its own.
- 11.45 Having explored the photographic opportunities of Snowhill we leave the car here and head north on foot towards Broadway Tower. The walk is approx. 5km and mildly undulating but offers some spectacular views and photography along the way!
- 13.15ish Arrive at Broadway Tower. There are various facilities here including a couple of cafes, the Tower itself plus a (decommissioned) nuclear bunker. Plenty to photograph and on a clear day you can take in some magnificent views across the Vale of Evesham - a great photographic spot. Your guide will leave you to explore the Tower area, returning to Snowhill to collect the car.
- 14.30 We collect you from Broadway Tower and head back by car to drop you off at your pick-up point by around 15.00

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"The Hidden Cotswolds Tour" : Guiting Power, Kineton, Temple
Guiting, Ford and Cutsdean

Tour Type: Walking

Tour Rating: moderately strenuous

Join us for this true Cotswold adventure! This is a walking tour that takes us off the tourist tracks and offers opportunities to see, and photograph, the "hidden" Cotswolds. Experience the magnificent Cotswold landscape in its true guise along with little known, but totally stunning, Cotswold villages. A real treat!

Itinerary (timings other than pick up and drop off are approximate):

- 08.30 Pick up (or, for groups of 4 people, meet at our starting point of Guiting Power)
- 09.00 Our starting point for the tour is the very picturesque village of Guiting Power. Quintessentially Cotswolds and boasting a lovely church, we will spend some time exploring the area.
- 09.45 We walk north from Guiting Power towards the little hamlet of Kineton approximately 2km away. On the way we pass through some stunning woodland / stream scenery as well as more open farming land of the "real" Cotswolds.
- 10.45 From Kineton we continue walking north towards the village of Temple Guiting another 2km away. The river Windrush passes through here and there are plenty of opportunities for some stunning photographs.
- 12.00 The walk continues from Temple Guiting to the tiny hamlet of Ford (approx. 2km). Small it maybe, but it has a very nice pub where we can stop for lunch.
- 14.00 From Ford we walk north about 1km and the very small, but very beautiful, village of Cutsdean. Superb opportunities for some classic Cotswold images are to be had here.
- 14.45 The last leg of our tour is a short (1.5km) walk to Stumps Cross. Here, high up on the escarpment, you can look out to the west and north over the Vale of Evesham for some very spectacular views indeed. A great end to the day!
- 15.45 Pick up from Stumps Cross and head back home.

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“Historic Cotswolds Tour” : Whithington and Chedworth Roman Villa

Tour Type: Walking

Tour Rating: moderately strenuous

Join us for this fabulous tour in the heart of the Cotswolds taking in two great villages (Whithington and Chedworth) plus the historic Chedworth Roman Villa. This is a tour that has to be experienced on foot, so it's leg power all the way! The tour covers superb Cotswold landscapes including expansive wooded areas and more open country, both prime areas for wildlife. The Roman Villa at Chedworth dates back to the 4th century AD and is currently owned by the National Trust. The Villa is open from early March to the end of November. Time (and season) permitting we can explore the Villa in more detail (entry to non NT members is about £11).

Itinerary (timings other than pick up and drop off are approximate):

- 08.00 Pick up (or, for groups of 4 people, meet at our starting point of Whithington)
- 08.30 We start the tour in the small village of Whithington and spend some time exploring the village and it's striking church
- 09.00 Head off on foot towards Chedworth via Whithington woods before emerging in to more open country. Some terrific landscape photography images can be had out here along with potential wildlife images including various bird species, hares and deer
- 11.30ish We should arrive at Chedworth village around lunchtime. There is a pub for refreshments and the village itself is worth exploring with your camera.
- 12.30 We head north from Chedworth back up in to the high country and the 1.5km walk to the Roman Villa. Nestled within the Chedworth Woods the setting of the Villa makes for some lovely images. Time permitting you will have the option to go into the Villa for a closer look at the historic remains
- 13.30ish From the Villa we begin the 4km wander back to Whithington, meeting up with the river Coln on the way. This part of the tour has varied scenery and landscapes as well as opportunity to see and photograph deer that inhabit the wooded areas around here.
- 15.30ish Arrive back at Whithington to collect our transport and make our way home to take a look at those amazing images you've captured!

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“The Ancient Cotswolds Tour” : Brockhampton, Winchcombe and Cleeve Hill

Tour Type: Walking Tour Rating: strenuous

If you like history and finding out about the past then this is the tour for you! We start by visiting the small, but very photogenic, villages of Brockhampton and Sevenhampton. The river Coln meanders its way through the villages making for some super scenic images. We then move on to the tiny hamlet of Charlton Abbots where we leave the car and take to the legs. The first stretch of the tour is straight forward as we follow the valley towards Winchcombe. Plenty of great photographic opportunities exist including old farm buildings, classic Cotswold sheep country, rolling hills and historic buildings including Sudeley Castle.

We spend some time in Winchcombe where we can get fed and watered. From there we head back towards Charlton Abbots by the “scenic” route – a climb out of the valley and up to the top of the escarpment to visit the large and historically significant long barrow of Bela’s Knap. If you enjoy walking and great scenery we guarantee you will not be disappointed by this tour!

Itinerary (timings other than pick up and drop off are approximate):

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| 07.00 | Pick up |
| 07.30 | Arrive at our first call point – the small villages of Sevenhampton and Brockhampton. Chance to obtain some lovely early morning images of these two very underrated villages |
| 09.00 | We drive the short distance to Charlton Abbots where we leave the vehicle and make our way on foot towards Winchcombe. A great region for landscape and wildlife photography |
| 11.00 | We have some free time in Winchcombe where there is plenty to explore and photograph and to have your lunch. |
| 12.30 | We head out of Winchcombe and back towards Charlton Abbots, making the climb out of the valley and up to the long barrow of Bela’s Knap. |
| 14.30 | We take a break at Bela’s Knap where there are plenty more opportunities for more great photography up here in the high country. |
| 15.00 | We head back to Charlton Abbots via some superb open and woodland countryside. |
| 16.30 | Return to the car and head back home! |
