

Photo Walk/Challenge 25 October 2025 @ 2pm

Meeting place: Leicester Clock Tower

Meeting time: 2 p.m.

Expected walk duration: 1 - 1.5 hours

Meeting at the clock tower your challenge will be to, individually or in groups, choose one or more of the locations on a list, provided on the day, at which to go and take photos. The only limitation is that your photo must, somewhere within the frame, include the object at that location that the theme of this walk is based around.

The locations are almost all within the boundary of the inner ring road, so the terrain is mostly level.

Once our time is up, I'm expecting the walk to take an hour to an hour and a half, we will meet up to share our images and have a vote for our favourite images.

Requirements:

Smartphone or your camera. If you're bringing an interchangeable lens camera, bear in mind that as we're going to be in an urban environment you will probably want to ensure that at the least you can cover typical



street photography focal lengths.

Preferred:

As this is in part being used as a practice for future walks and trips, I am looking to set up a WhatsApp group for this walk for sharing messages between everyone while we are out and about, so, if you are able, please put this on your phone and set it up in advance. If you do not use a smartphone I will either make sure you're with my group as we walk about or use basic SMS messages to update you.

Optional:

I want to see how feasible it is for members to upload images to PhotoEntry while we're out and about so I can share everyone's images from one device when we meet up at the end.

The maximum file size for PhotoEntry is 10MB, therefore please also bear the following in mind:

Smartphone users:

Please make sure you have an app on your phone that will let you specify the maximum resolution and adjust the compression for your image when you export it so that it will fit within the PhotoEntry limits.

Camera users:

Check how to transfer images from your camera to your phone (for more modern cameras there should be an app from the manufacturer that will allow you to connect wirelessly to access your images).

As with smartphone users, check that you have an editing app on your phone that will allow you to specify



the maximum dimensions and adjust image compression to manage the file size of your exported image.

I will be bringing a card reader with me that can handle SD and CFExpress Type B cards in case you are unable to offload your images to your phone to upload.
