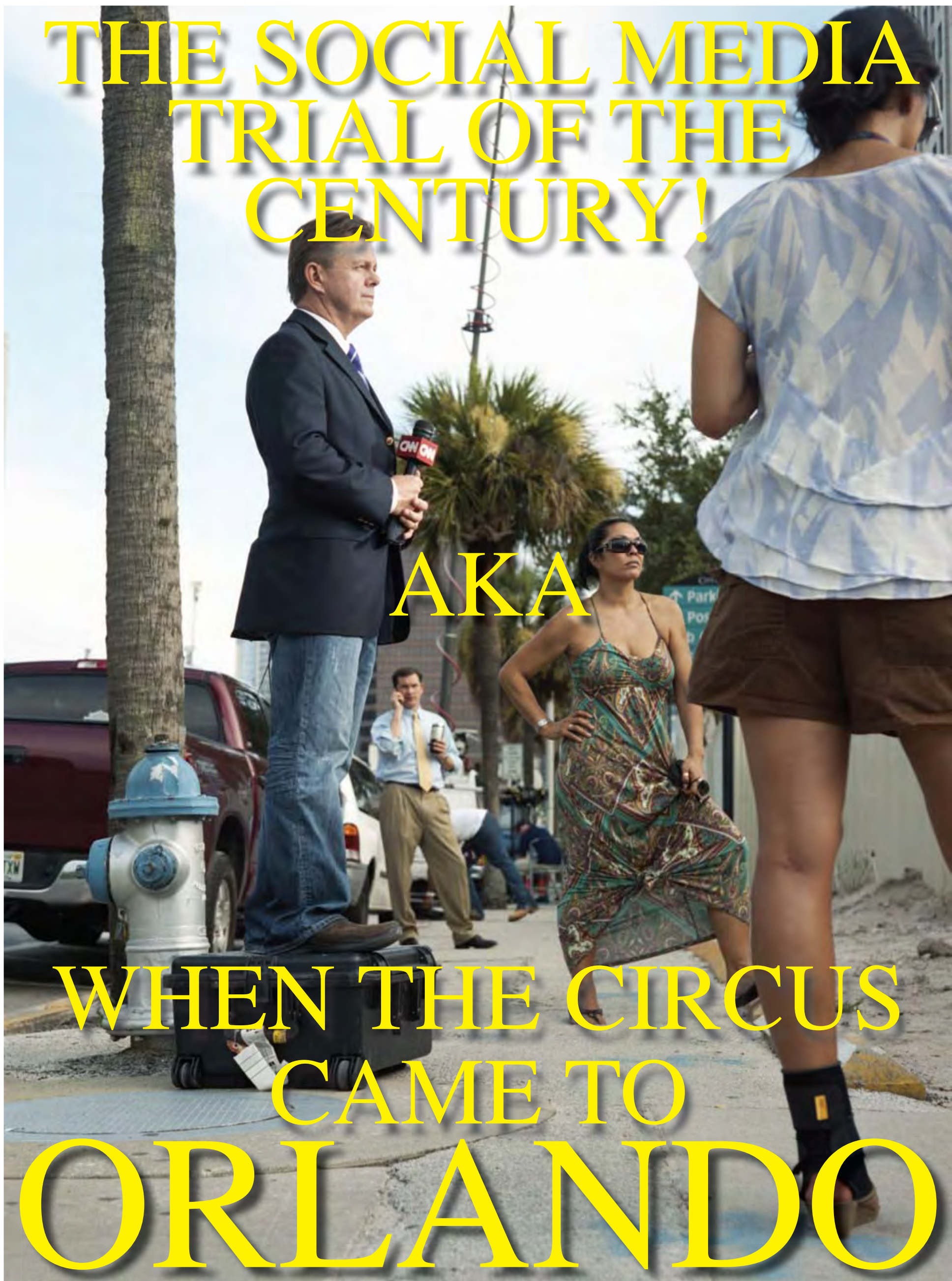

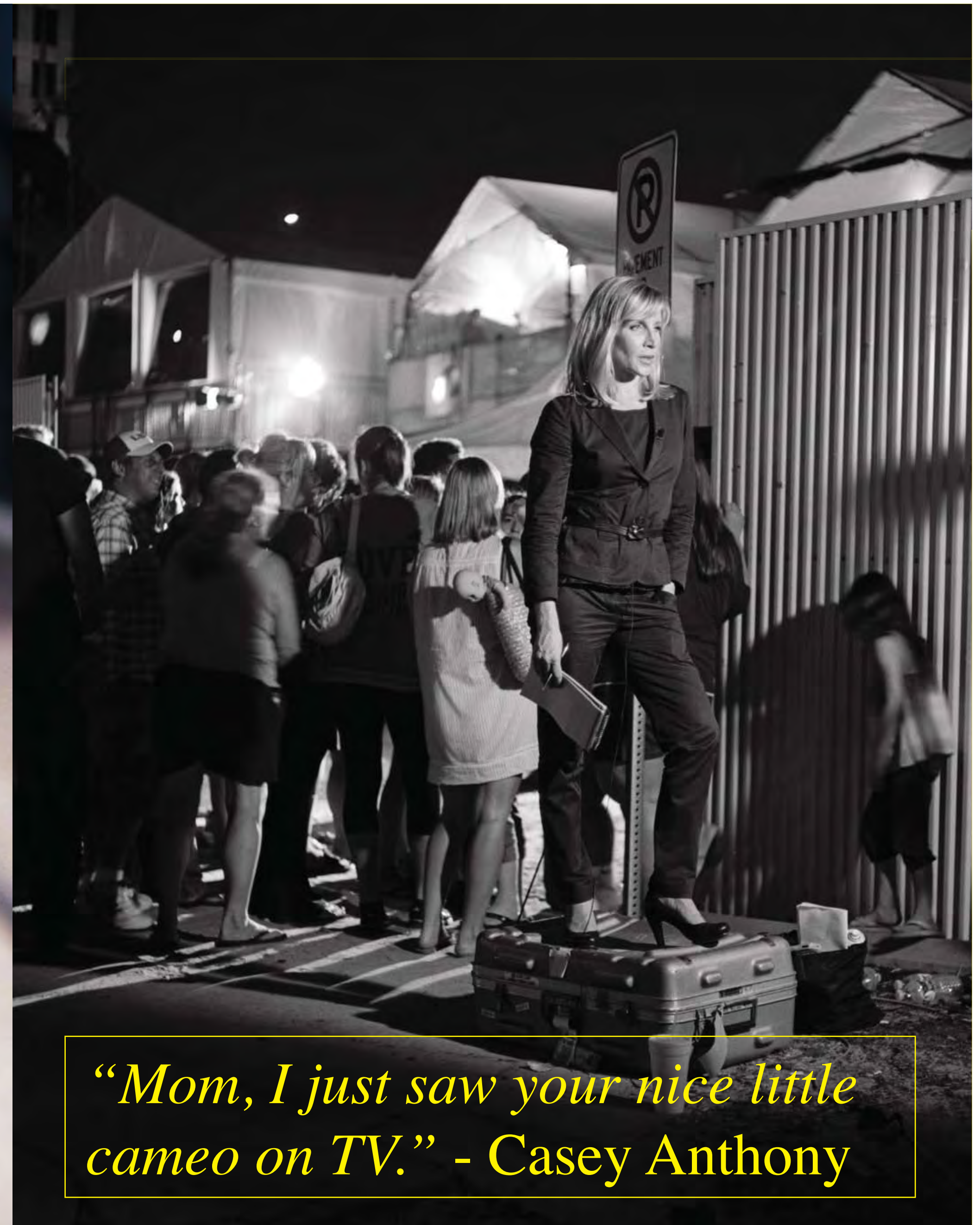
“Caylee’s missing,” and “I found my daughter’s car today and it smells like there has been a dead body in the damn car.”

On October 14, 2008 Casey Anthony was indicted by a grand jury of first-degree murder, aggravated manslaughter, and aggravated child abuse regarding the disappearance and death of her two year old daughter Caylee Anthony. She was reported missing by her grandmother Cindy Anthony on July 15, 2008. Caylee was last seen alive on June 16, 2008.

On May 24, 2011 the Casey Anthony Trial started in Orlando, Florida. By July 5, 2011 the jury acquitted Casey Anthony of all felony charges, but she was convicted of all four misdemeanors that included charges of giving false information to a law enforcement. Caylee’s body was found in a wooded area near the family’s house on December 11, 2008, but they never found her killer.

During the duration of the trial the news media from all over the world camped out in front of Orange County Courthouse. The media interviewed anybody related to the trial including spectators just to fill up air time.

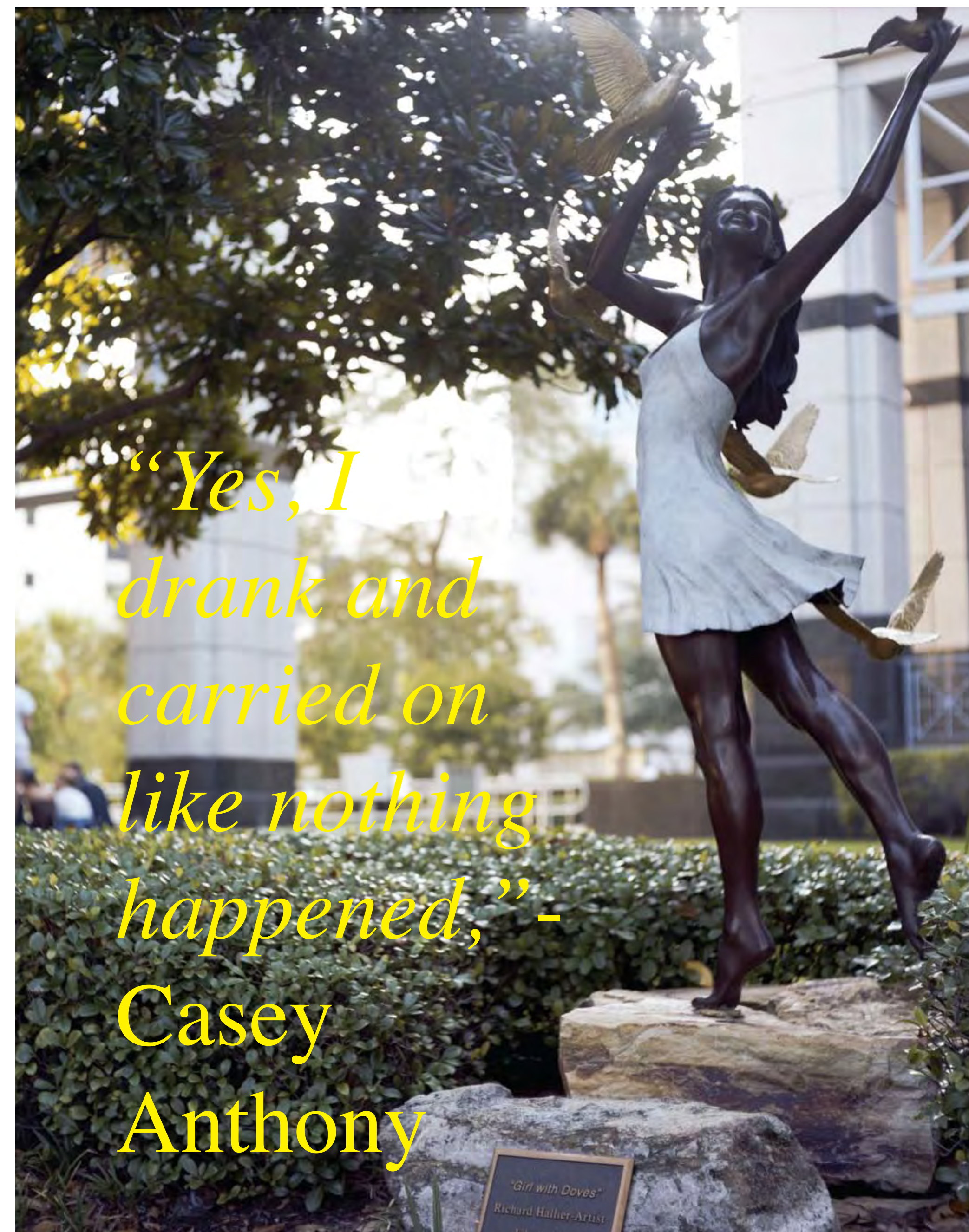

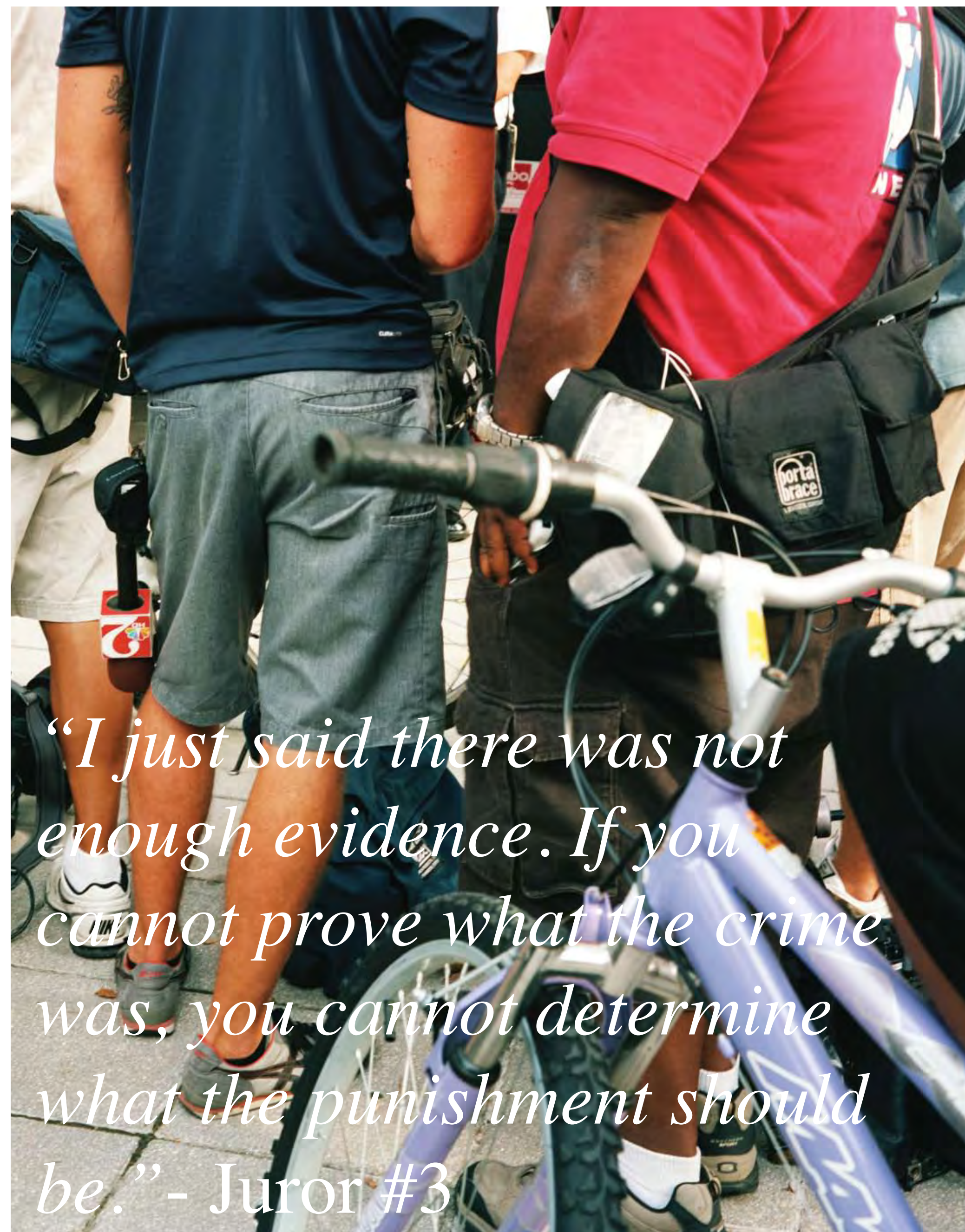

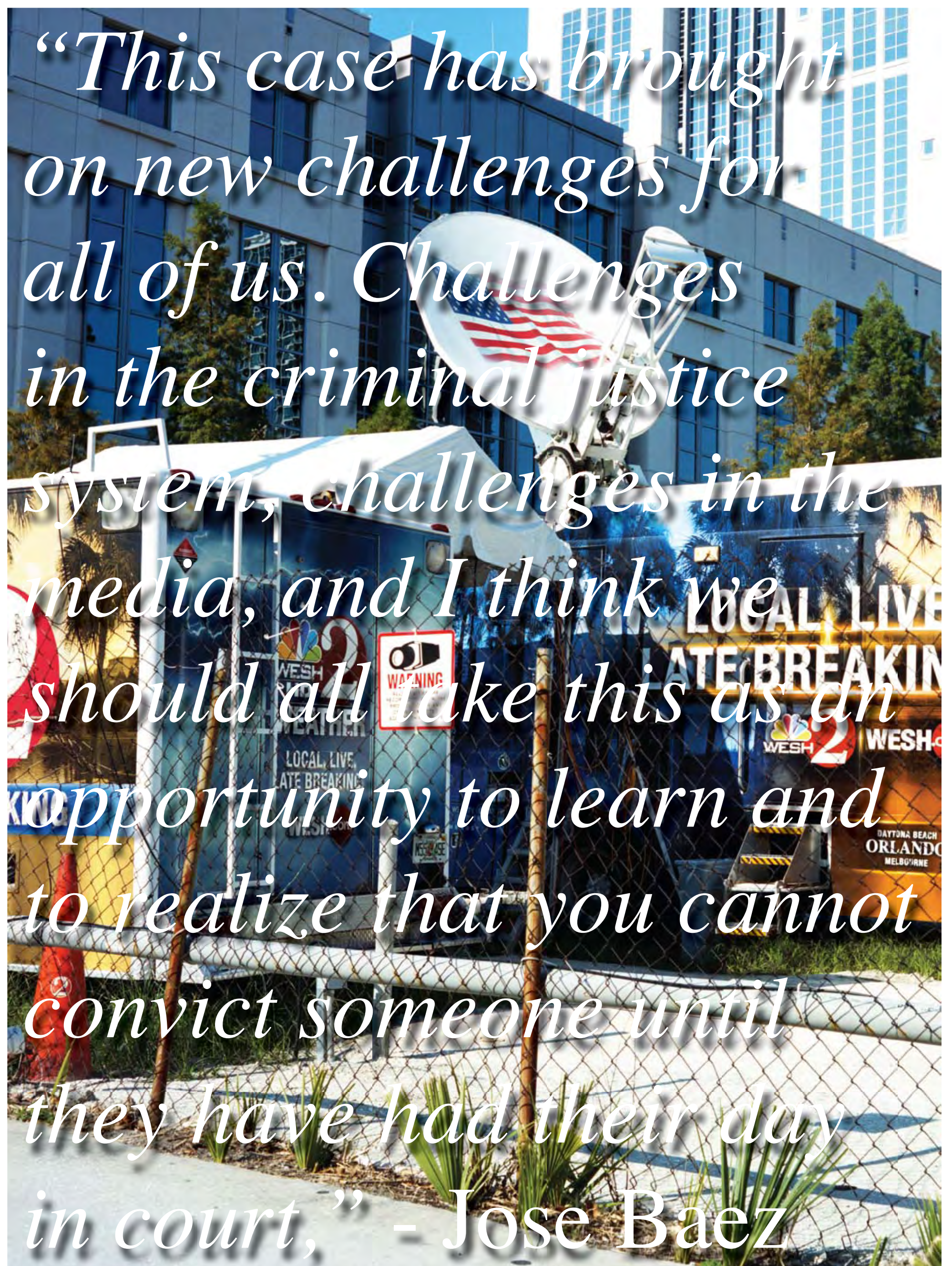
