### 12<sup>th</sup> October: Annual Projected Image Competition

**Judge: Alison Jenkins LRPS.** An open competition with a maximum of four colour and/or monochrome images, each less than four years old. None should have been entered in this competition before and no more than two entered into any previous internal competition.

## 14<sup>th</sup> October (Saturday): External - Panel of Six Prints Inter-Club Competition

Hosted by Chelmsford Camera Club at the Parish Hall, St Augustine's Way, Springfield, CM1 6GX at 2.00pm. **Judge: Richard Walton FRPS MPAGB EFIAP BPE3\*** from Kent.

Panels must consist of 6 prints. There is no set subject for the panels. Panels are submitted on the day of the competition. A panel may be composed of the work of one or more authors. A statement of intent must accompany every panel on a separate sheet of paper from the hanging plan. The statement should not exceed 50 words and may include a title for the panel. 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## 19th October: "A Photographic Journey with Birds"

## 16<sup>th</sup> November: "Photography Pictorialism from the late 19<sup>th</sup> Century to the early 20<sup>th</sup> Century"

**Tony Bramley FRPS** will present an exploration of the beginnings of photography as art, known as Pictorialism. Tony will be outlining the emergence of the movement and how it changed the voice of the amateur photographer. Tony will demonstrate how with digital post-processing we can still emulate this style of photography. This presentation contains artistic nude studies.

Tony has been a photographer for over 20 years and is the owner of Storm Photography based in Marks Tey, Nr Colchester in Essex. Work photography includes weddings, portraits and commercial photography. Tony is also proficient in all post production software and printing techniques. Tony is also a Fellow of the Royal Photographic Society. Additionally, he works as an abstract artist in a process derived from the Modern art movement of Suprematism.

The images should be numbered in projection sequence and should not be more than four years old. No image should have been entered in this

competition before and no more than two in each set should have been entered in any previous internal competition.

e-Luminate Cambridge is a contemporary arts festival for a city at the forefront of scientific and technological research. **Judge: Sarah Kelman ARPS**. Hosted by Peterborough Photographic Society and open to Swavesey Camera Club members. Venue: Parkway Sports and Social Club, Maskew Avenue, Bourges Boulevard Retail Park, Peterborough, PE1 2AS, starting at 7.30pm

The theme of the competition is "*Creative Photography*". Many photographers have a great sense of creativity and want to break away from the rules and constraints of traditional photographs. Entries can be of any subject that embodies the elements of good design, arrangement or composition, and reflects the personal interpretation of the photographer, who wants to illustrate an idea. Each entrant may submit a maximum of three PDIs and/or three prints. These must be current work which has not been used previously in this competition and can be of any subject. All work must be delivered to the competition organiser at least one week before the competition is to be judged. There is an entrance fee of £4 per person. Martin says: "Cambridge seems to me to be revealing itself in a new way, purely because of how hard I am looking; lately the city itself has become the subject of most of my photographs. I'm trying to take images that go beyond the established rhetoric for the city, which has held good for centuries. It holds a more secret majesty, and I am trying to capture that. The attempt to capture images that are different in kind to all the others taken here every day in their thousands - has proved challenging but exhilarating. If it means crawling under bridges or climbing trees to get the pictures. then I will likely continue crawling and climbing until I drown or fall." A popular PAGB lecturer and judge, he came to Swavesey to Judge our Monochrome Trophy competition in 2015. This talk gives his vision of photography – never to mimic other photographers, but to identify elements of scenes that interest him and allow time at the location for the creative process to develop (Supported by Fotospeed)

24<sup>th</sup> May: Pairs Competition

Judge: Colin Strong CPAGB LRPS. A recent innovation in the club's calendar, the Pairs Competition provides a context for experienced and developing photographers in the club to work together. The submitted images need to have been taken on a shared photo-shoot and the post-processing should have been done together. There does not need to be any link between the images – they will be judged completely independently and then the four scores added up to work out the winners. PDI submissions are required.
